

The following is a list of documents The Law Offices of Steven K. Deig will want to review in connection with your divorce. Depending on the issues involved you will want to produce documents going back approximately a year prior to the date of your appointment.

There are certain situations that may require you gather documents going farther back, in which case your attorney will advise your accordingly.

Do your best to gather these items and organize them into separate folders for each category, if possible. Getting these documents together early on in the divorce process will help speed-up the divorce process as well as preserve critical evidence that will be needed to resolve your case.

	Individual income tax returns for the past three to five years (federal, state, and local)	
	Business income tax returns for the past three to five years (federal, state, and local)	
	Proof of your current income (W-2 forms, 1099 forms, K-1 forms, 3 most recent paystubs)	
	Proof of spouse's current income (W-2 forms, 1099 forms, K-1 forms, 3 most recent pay-stubs)	
	Prenuptial agreement or post-marital agreements, if any	
	Divorce decrees and court orders from previous marriages	
	Checking, Savings, Money Markets, CD's, Brokerage, and any other type of account statements	
	Pension plan and 401K statements	
	Retirement account statements	
	Wills, trusts, living wills, powers of attorney, durable powers of attorney	
	Stock portfolios, LLC's, any other investments	

S	Stock options: grant documents, vesting schedules, account statements
N	Mortgage statements for all properties
F	Property tax statements
(	Credit card statements
	Loan documents and loan applications including consumer loan applications such as for a car loan

(	Other bills (e.g., school tuition, unreimbursed medical bills, etc.)
F	Employment contracts
I	Life insurance policies
F	Health insurance policies

	List of personal property, including home furnishings, jewelry, artwork, computers, nome office equipment, clothing and furs, etc.
I	List of real property and assets owned by each spouse prior to marriage
I	List of contents of safety deposit boxes
	Copies of any other personal debts or notes signed to anyone, including family members
	hotographs of family, children, furniture, your home, or valuable collections to the extent that you feel these photos will help you "tell your story"
